Conservation is key to saving money on utilities

It may be the middle of winter but utility bills are a reminder of a hot and dry summer. A severe drought produced some of the highest water usage in years. With most of Minnesota still suffering with some level of drought conditions, climatologists predict 2022 could be another challenging year.

As with most cities, Minnetonka residents pay for what you use. Metro area homes tend to use more than the state average of 52 gallons of water per person each day. Irrigation systems are often the biggest culprit. It will be important to take steps early this season to avoid bigger bills later.

- Repair or upgrade irrigation systems
- Inspect and repair leaky faucets and toilets
- Use dishwashers instead of handwashing

There is another contributor to utility bills. Aging infrastructure. Each year the number of water main breaks increases. Minnetonka continues to use a pay-as-you-go approach spreading the costs of expensive infrastructure replacement across several years rather than charging special assessments.

The city's tiered rates are designed to encourage conservation. The highest users are billed nearly twice as much as the lowest users. For 2022, households with low to average water use will see water and sewer rate increases of just 2 or 3 percent. Visit minnetonkamn.gov/utilitybilling to review the 2022 residential utility rates.

Renewable Energy Challenge

This February and March, the City of Minnetonka is challenging Minnetonka households to power their homes with renewable energy by subscribing to Xcel Energy's Windsource program. Participating households will be entered to win prizes from local businesses!

What is Windsource?

Windsource is a voluntary subscription program from Xcel Energy enabling you to source your electricity from wind. It's an easy way to lower your carbon footprint without investing in any equipment. Renters with an Xcel Energy electric account can also participate.

How does it work?

You can subscribe through Xcel Energy for as little as \$1 per month, and it only takes 5 minutes to sign up. You decide how much wind energy to purchase, up to 100% of your electric use. A typical home using 750 kWh of electricity per month could get 100% of its electricity from renewable energy for about \$7.50 per month.

Tree sale begins Feb. 7

Minnetonka's annual tree sale is a great way to replace a tree in your yard, add shade and help the environment. Residents can buy young trees at a reduced cost and help expand the city's tree canopy. This year's sale includes 15 species of shade trees, shrubs, ornamental and fruit trees, and evergreen trees. The sale is held exclusively online beginning Monday, Feb. 7.

Planting and maintaining trees

Add a tree guard.

Hungry deer, rodents and rabbits love to eat tree bark, buds and leaves especially in winter. Protect your new planting with a tree guard! Note: Tree guards can damage conifers or clump/ multi-stem trees - use wire caging instead.



Consider using a watering bag.

Zip a heavy-duty plastic bag around your young tree and fill it once every 5-7 days. The bag slowly releases about



20 gallons of water into the soil over a period of hours.

They'll help you choose the right species and number of trees for your site, and you'll get the same low price offered to private property owners.
