Whether it's responding to emergencies or working to prevent one, Minnetonka's fire and police departments work each day to build a safe and healthy community. They serve in the midst of rapidly changing times. Calls for medical emergencies continue to increase, firefighters must protect bigger building and police are more likely to encounter people in the midst of a mental health crisis. The departments are also called to meet other challenges from staffing and recruitment, to more sophisticated training and equipment.



"We appreciate the support the community has consistently shown for the work we do," says Police Chief Scott Boerboom. "As we look the future, it is essential that we continue to reflect our community. We want everyone to trust our emergency services."



Mayors' Monarch Pledge

Each year, Minnetonka's Natural Resources Division renews the Mayors' Monarch Pledge to show the city's dedication to monarch and pollinator conservation. The monarch population dropped significantly due to loss of breeding habitat and other pressures. While hundreds of communities joined the



National Wildlife Federation program this year, Minnetonka is one of a handful of communities that committed to 24 or more actions to promote conservation. Once completed, the city will renew its Monarch Champion designation.


