# Hopkins Crossroad Trail Project

- 1.2 miles of new trail
  - East side of Hopkins Crossroad
- High priority
  - Critical safety improvement
  - Major multi-use transit corridor
  - Alternative transit access to 3 schools and 3 religious institutions
  - Completes a missing trail connection
  - Close to Hopkins, St. Louis Park and Plymouth
  - Sustainable
- Environmental Improvements
  - Stormwater drainage and sediment capture
  - Increased stormwater treatment



# **Hopkins Crossroad Trail**

- Tier 1 Corridor on Met Council's Regional Bicycle Transportation Network (RBTN) plan
- Aligns with the Hennepin County 2040 Bicycle Transportation Plan
- High priority segment in Minnetonka's Trail Improvement Plan









# Safety & Sustainability

- Safety Improvements
  - Off-road paved trail for all users
  - Shoulders for on-road bikers
  - Crossing refuge at Live Oak Drive
  - Year-round maintenance including plowing
- Sustainability
  - Storm sewer and water quality improvements
  - Limited tree impacts
  - Burial of overhead power
- Partnership with Hennepin County
  - Shared design elements
  - Coordinated projects




Existing conditions – Hopkins Crossroad (looking north)

# Hopkins Crossroad Trail

- Preliminary design and feasibility report complete
- Easement needs determined






## Proposed Improvements

- Trail Improvements
  - 8' wide paved trail along east side of Hopkins Crossroad and south side of Hillside Lane West
    - 4'-5' boulevard and at back of curb
  - Concrete curb and gutter
  - Retaining walls
  - Retain roadway shoulder for service vehicles and road cyclists
- Utility Improvements
  - Storm sewer improvements, and minimal water main hydrant relocation
- Overhead power burial to accommodate trail
- Relocate mail boxes between trail and curb





# **Proposed Improvements**



# **Enhanced Pedestrian Crossing**

- Median provides refuge for pedestrians
- Users only need to look one way at a time for oncoming traffic
- Median will help calm traffic
- Provides safe crossing for users to the west





# Maintenance Responsibilities

- Trail owned by the city
- Future replacement by the city
- Snow removal completed by the city
- Ongoing maintenance by the city
- Grass behind trail maintained by homeowners

# **Construction Impacts**

- Property Access
  - Maintain accesses to neighborhoods and businesses.
  - Coordination to maintain garbage service, mail and busing.
  - Construction Hours
    - 7 a.m. -10 p.m. M-F
    - 8 a.m. 6 p.m. Saturday
    - No work on Sundays or holidays
- Boulevard/Property Impacts
  - Tree/shrub removal
  - Driveways
  - Landscaping and rain gardens
  - Turf restoration
  - Sprinkler systems
- Easements



# Construction Cost and Funding

- Estimated Total Project Costs
  - \$6.8 million
- Minnetonka was successful in receiving \$2.3 million from the Regional Solicitation with the Metropolitan Council in 2020
- City funds
  - Trail System Expansion Fund
  - Electric Franchise Fees
- Other grant opportunities

### WHAT IS BEING PROPOSED?

We're proposing to construct an eight-foot-wide, multi-use bituminous trail for pedestrians and bicyclists. This plan also includes burial of overhead power and cable lines in this corridor. Project goals include improving safety, mobility and connectivity along Hopkins Crossroad.

#### PROJECT SCHEDULE

- 2023 Bury overhead power and cable lines
   2024 Construct trail
- 2024 Construct trail

### POTENTIAL PROJECT IMPACTS

Projects of this nature can be disruptive. Proposed impacts may include limited and alternative access to businesses and homes, driveway and retaining wall construction, and tree removal. The city will work to minimize these impacts as much as possible as plans are finalized.

### IF THIS PROJECT IS APPROVED, WILL I BE ASSESSED?

No. These types of improvements are primarily funded through the Trail System Expansion Fund, as well as other funding opportunities through Hennepin County and other agencies.
