Contractor expo will support community development

Whether the project is big or small, online permitting has helped contractors and homeowners keep pace with the rapid growth of building in the community. While the shift online began more than 10 years ago, it has accelerated more recently in the midst of the pandemic.

"You can submit, track and modify construction plans all without ever having to visit city hall," said Julie Wischnack, Minnetonka's community development director. "That's made the process easier and more efficient, but we know people are still left with a wide range of questions."

That's one reason why Minnetonka will host a contractor's expo early next year. The half-day expo will take place Thursday, Feb. 2. City staff is designing it to be a one-stop shop for builders and contractors across the region.

> "We are really excited to once again offer an event like this," said Wischnack. "It will provide a great overview of everything from permit and inspection requirements to resources for small businesses and sustainability ideas."

The event will be free. Registration and detailed program information will be available later this year.

Sign up for Smart911

You can help emergency responders better answer calls by sharing critical information about you and your family before you need help.

Smart911 allows residents to create a safety profile for your household. When you make an emergency call, your safety profile is automatically displayed to the 911 dispatcher, giving the dispatcher more background and location information than before.



Choose which details you'd like to include, such as:

- Emergency contact information
- Medical information, including mental health
- Number of people and pets on the property
- Location data

Register your video surveillance camera

Security cameras can be a great tool when solving crimes. But police are not always aware who has




surveillance cameras and potentially vital information to help solve a crime.

Residents and businesses can voluntarily register your private video surveillance systems through the new SafeCam program. Should a crime occur in or near where

a camera is installed, Minnetonka officers can contact you for potentially valuable video.

- 100-percent voluntary
- Does not provide police with access to security camera systems or footage
- Seeks any kind of surveillance camera systems (e.g., video doorbells, wireless, home security)

"SafeCam is another tool helping us deter and solve crime," Det. Sgt. Ryan Piper said. "It allows us to partner with private camera

Right-of-way pruning begins soon

The city will prune trees and shrubs in the public right-of-way from November through March. This work is completed to improve sight lines, clear dead and broken branches and prepare for road construction projects. City crews and contractors will complete the work under the supervision of forestry staff.



Property owners will be notified by mail if right-of-way pruning is scheduled in their neighborhood. Call 952-988-8421 to ask questions or learn more.

Winter is a good time for pruning

Plan to prune in the winter, when trees - along with potentially harmful insects and diseases - are dormant. Visit **minnetonkamn.gov/NRyou** to find our "Proper Pruning" handout.

Drop off leaves through Nov. 19

Each fall, the city accepts leaves, yard waste and brush from Minnetonka residents at the Public Works Facility at 11522 Minnetonka Blvd. Residents must present a driver's license, state ID or utility bill. Commercial services must prove materials came from a Minnetonka address.




