Minnetonka updates energy use plan

The goal is to cut greenhouse gas emissions by 41% in seven years

This fall, the city council approved an update to Minnetonka's Energy Action Plan. The city will work with utilities and the Center for Energy and Environment to carry out the new action steps. The work is the equivalent of removing 35,000 passenger vehicles from the road for one year. Visit **minnetonkamn.gov/green** to view the plan.



Sewer, recycling rates to increase in 2023

To keep pace with rising sanitary sewer costs from the Metropolitan Council Environmental Services (MCES), residents will see an increase in their sanitary sewer rate next year.

The increase is a pass-through charge from MCES based on sewage flow metered within Minnetonka. MCES provides sewer treatment for a majority of the Twin Cities metro region, including the City of Minnetonka. The rate will increase from \$2.80 to \$3.60 per thousand gallons.

To offset the larger sanitary sewer increase, the water variable rate and the fixed infrastructure fee will remain the same. While a departure from the city's long-term utility rate structure plan, Finance Director Darin Nelson says the sanitary sewer rate now fully covers the pass-through charge from MCES.

Even though the city's population has increased over the past decade, sanitary sewer flows and overall water usage have steadily decreased over this same period, due to more watersaving appliances, education in the conservation of natural resources and tiered water rates.

Residents will also see a slight increase for recycling fees in 2023. The quarterly fee will increase to \$21.15 to cover, in part, rising yard waste disposal costs. In recent years, the city has seen an increase in volume of yard waste collected, as well as the costs to grind and transport the waste.

Register your alarm system

All homeowners and businesses must register alarm systems with the Minnetonka Police Department.

The city partners with CryWolf Services for alarm system registration, payment and monitoring. You can register, pay online (\$20 annual fee) and find tips to prevent false alarms at **minnetonkamn.gov/alarm-registration**.
