ANTICIPATED FUTURE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT EXPENSES

- Opus park* unfunded, estimated \$15M
- Opus police/fire substation unknown, unfunded
- The Marsh unknown, unfunded
- Hopkins trail project* partially unfunded, estimated \$6.82M
- Community Center recent bid \$2.2M
- Natural resource restoration projects CIP
- Other trail projects \$80M, franchise fees, park dedication, tax levy

*State bonding dollars are also being pursued.

- 2022-2023 Detailed design, property acquisition and bidding. (\$725,000 Request)
- 2024-2025 Construction of central plaza and improvement of open spaces. (\$3 M)
- Total project \$15 M



HOPKINS CROSSROAD TRAIL PROJECT

- 1.2 miles of new trail
- High priority
 - Critical safety improvement
 - Major multi-use transit corridor
 - Alternative transit access to 3 schools and 3 religious institutions
- Environmental Improvements
 - Stormwater drainage and sediment capture
 - Increased stormwater treatment

LOCAL OPTION SALES TAX

- An alternate revenue option to property taxes
 - Estimated at \$4.33M per year
- City issues debt and uses sales tax revenue to pay for principal and interest payments. Sunsets.
- Project(s) specific & meet regional significance standard
- Requires resolution and statutory approval
- Requires local referendum
- Requires passing an ordinance.

NEXT STEPS - 2023

- Staff will evaluate costs related to potential projects that meet regional significance.
 - Opus park, Opus police/fire substation, The Marsh, Hopkins trail project, Community Center, Natural resource restoration projects, Other trail projects
- Perform analysis impact. Partner with the University of Minnesota Extension.
 - Maple Grove: \$3K and estimated 6 months
- Initiate a dialog with the Minneapolis Regional Chamber.

ESTIMATED TIMELINE

- Current to Dec. 2023: Next steps- as outlined on previous slide
- By December 2023: Review U of M analysis impact & discuss whether to proceed.
- Jan. 31, 2024: adopt resolution and submit to state tax committees
- Summer 2024: adopt resolution
- Summer of 2024 to Nov. 25: public engagement/education campaign
- Nov. 2025: Hold a referendum (legal opinion)
- Nov./Dec. 2025: Pass an ordinance
- Jan 1 to June 30, 2025: education campaign/business outreach
- July 1, 2025: soonest sales tax revenue collection
