Voters keep ranked choice voting

Minnetonka voters supported keeping ranked choice voting for city municipal elections.

Minnetonka voters were asked whether to repeal ranked choice voting for municipal elections and reinstate the use of a primary (if needed) and general election.

A majority of Minnetonka voters (58.66 percent) voted no on the ballot question, supporting the continued use of ranked choice voting for city elections.

Ranked choice voting is a system where voters rank their candidates in order of preference. It was originally enacted in Minnetonka for the 2021 election.

2023 ELECTION

Four councilmembers elected to city council

Minnetonka voters elected two new members to the Minnetonka City Council. Newcomers Patsy Foster-Bolton (Ward 1) and Paula Ramaley (Ward 3) join incumbents Rebecca Schack (Ward 2) and Kissy C. Coakley (Ward 4) on the council.

The councilmembers will begin serving four-year terms in January.

2024 budget focuses on public safety

The council will vote on adoption of the final 2024 budget and tax levy. The 2024 budget and levy reflect the council's commitment to public safety by beginning the multiyear implementation of the public safety master plan.

The budget includes adding four police officers, one police sergeant and three full-time firefighter technicians. The new positions will help cover growing call volumes, ensure training meets professional standards and improve emergency response in the northern part of the city. The 2024 budget and levy would also restore funding to the city's capital improvement program (CIP) to prepandemic levels.

In September, the council set the maximum 2024 preliminary tax levy at a no-more-than 7.75 percent increase. The council is anticipated to adopt the final levy Dec. 4.


What does this mean for the average homeowner?

City property taxes for the median-valued Minnetonka home (\$496,500 for taxes payable in 2024) will see a monthly increase of \$10.50. The exact impact on specific properties depends on the assessed market value of each home. The numbers do not include any proposed increases from other taxing jurisdictions, such as the county and local school district.

Sauna in the Parks will run from Dec. 27-Jan. 2 at Shady Oak Beach.

Ages 18 and older can register for a 1.5-hour session in the Voyageur Mobile Sauna, equipped with a wood fire stove, outdoor bonfire and overall glamping ambiance. The lake will be open to registered guests for an optional cold plunge.



"Our recreation department is always cooking up creative ways of engaging our community and getting people using our parks in the winter," said Recreation Program Manager Jesse Izquierdo. "Activities that build community and are focused on health and wellness are seeing a surge in popularity."

While saunas have been used for thousands of years, they're experiencing a resurgence as people see the physical benefits of the practice. "Saunaing" is a fun way to relax with friends while reducing stress, easing pain and improving cardiovascular health.

"Ultimately, we're hoping this will entice more people to get outside in the winter, embrace the north and build community," Izquierdo said.
