City hall will be open extended hours Saturday, Nov. 2 (10 a.m. to 3 p.m.) and Monday, Nov. 4 (8 a.m. to 5 p.m.) to accommodate voters.

Hennepin County oversees all absentee voting by mail. Complete an application at

hennepin.us/residents/elections/absentee-voting to receive a ballot and instructions. Ballots must be returned by election day to count.

New police program offers a helping hand

A new Minnetonka Police Department program goes beyond serving and protecting - it offers resources and a caring, helping hand to residents in need.

The Case Assessment Management Program (CAMP) is a new short-term, mental health case management initiative intended to improve access to mental health services. The program – a partnership between the Minnetonka and Plymouth police departments and Hennepin County – pairs a county social worker with police departments to provide additional assistance and services to mental health crisis calls. Minnetonka has trained a team of officers – the Crisis Intervention Team – to assist in these specific situations.



Here's how the new program works:

- 1. Minnetonka officers respond to initial mental health crisis calls.
- 2. Cases are referred into CAMP for assessment.
- 3. Follow-up is conducted by the social worker or a specially trained officer.
- 4. Those in need of further assistance are referred to partner organizations Relate Counseling Center, Vail Place or Headway Emotional Health for therapy, counseling or long-term case management.

The goal of the program is to provide real, long-term solutions, rather than simply responding to calls for service. The program aims to be a win-win for residents and police – help will be provided to those who need it and hopefully result in fewer repeat service calls.

City council sets limit for 2020 property tax levy

Each September, the city council is required to set a maximum preliminary tax levy before approving the following year's budget. This year, the council set the preliminary tax levy for the 2020 budget at its Sept. 16 meeting, which occurred after the Minnetonka Memo went to print. The council will continue to review and discuss 2020 city property taxes and finances prior to final adoption in December.

Property owners will receive proposed 2020 tax notices from Hennepin County in November.

Ask a city planner

In each issue of the Minnetonka Memo, our planners answer a common question to help residents and businesses learn more about the planning process and available city resources.

Question:

Can I add an apartment onto my home for my parents, in-laws, college-aged children or others?



Answer:

An accessory apartment, commonly referred to as a "guest" or "mother-in-law" apartment, is a smaller secondary dwelling in a larger single-family home. It requires city council approval for a conditionaluse permit.

The council will review to determine if it meets city code:

- The apartment must be incorporated into a home without changing the home's character
- Unattached dwelling units are not allowed
- Off-street parking must be available
- The property owner must reside in one of the units
- Code also restricts the size of the apartment

Tackle buckthorn in cold weather

Like many plants, buckthorn goes dormant in cold weather, making it easier to recognize and access. Here's how you can identify, remove and dispose of buckthorn on your property to help us control this invasive species.

Identify

The following characteristics distinguish buckthorn from similar-looking shrubs, such as chokecherry and American plum.

- Oval leaves with tiny teeth, growing opposite each other; may stay attached and green through November
- Paired leaf buds at the tip of most twigs, resembling a tiny hoof print with a thorn in between
- Black berries (on female plants) that cling to the stem through much of winter.

Remove

- 1. Target female buckthorn with fruit to limit seed dispersal.
- 2. Cut stumps about a foot high (making them easy to relocate).
- 3. Return in early spring (when temperatures are above 32 degrees) to re-cut stumps about one inch above the ground.
- 4. Apply an herbicide solution of 20 percent glyphosate to the outer growth rings of freshly cut stumps. Wick applicators are ideal.

Properly dispose of the debris

Bag up berries and deposit them in the trash (not with organic recycling or compost). Use buckthorn logs to reduce erosion on slopes, chip them on-site for mulch or transport debris to the city's brush drop.
