**Accepted items:** appliances, batteries, bicycles, carpet and padding, doors, fluorescent bulbs, furniture, lumber, mattresses and box springs, propane tanks, scrap metal, tires, toilets, non-metal sinks and windows.

New in 2019: Used clothing, shoes, towels and bedding will be accepted this year!

**Not accepted:** electronics, garbage, hazardous waste, liquids, copiers, fax machines

**Payment:** There is a charge for all items except batteries, bicycles, fluorescent bulbs, clean scrap metal and clothing. Cash and checks payable to "City of Minnetonka" are accepted.

# Fall leaf drop-off site opens Sept. 21

Each fall, the city accepts leaves, yard waste and brush from Minnetonka residents at the Public Works Facility at 11522 Minnetonka Blvd. Residents must present a driver's license, state ID or Minnetonka utility bill. Commercial tree and lawn services must prove materials came from a Minnetonka address.

Keep leaves and yard waste separate from brush and drop off in their respective areas. Bags cannot be left at the drop-off site, including compostable bags.

The leaf drop-off site is open between Sept. 21 and Nov. 23. Friday and Sunday hours aren't offered until November.

#### **Answer:**

We keep records of approved city permits. To see a list of permits for your property from the last 20 years, follow these steps. To receive copies of actual approved permits, call us at 952-939-8394.

- 1. Visit eminnetonka.com/permits
- 2. Click "Search for property permit history"
- 3. Click "Search for Permit"
- 4. Search by address, date, contractor, permit type or permit number

For permits more than 20 years old, visit city hall (14600 Minnetonka Blvd.) to search through our physical records.



## Review your fire safety plan this fall

The start of a new school year is the perfect time to review your family's fire safety plan. In an average fire, you have only three minutes to safely escape, so it's important for everyone in the house to know the plan.

Follow these reminders to keep your family safe from fire:

- Have working smoke alarms on every level and in every bedroom.
- Make sure your family has a fire escape plan in place and practice it.



- Know two exits from every room.
- Ensure windows can open and screens can be easily removed.
- Establish a safe family meeting place outside the home.
- Encourage children to know how and when to call 911.
- Have a fire extinguisher and ensure everyone knows how to use it.


### Minnetonka Historical Society seeks volunteers

## Tips to deal with yard waste this fall

Fall yard work inevitably results in piles of yard waste - leaves, twigs and grass clippings. Follow these tips to ensure yard waste is properly reused or disposed of to protect our environment.



- Compost leaves, grass and native plant clippings to make mulch.
- Mow grass clippings and leaves back onto the lawn.
- Bag waste for curbside collection or bring it to the city's leaf and brush drop-off site. See Page 3 for details.
- Don't burn yard waste or brush.
- Remember, it is illegal to dump yard waste or brush in streets, wetlands, woodlands or bodies of water.

### Prepare your trees and shrubs for winter

Trees and shrubs need extra care to survive the winter. Follow these tips to ensure a productive spring growing season.

- Water when there is less than one inch of rainfall per week until the ground freezes.
- Check soil moisture.
   If it's dry, water.
   If it's damp, wait.
- Use a low-flow or soaker hose instead of sprinklers, or install treewatering bags.
- Ensure the entire root zone receives water from the trunk to the farthest branch tips.



- Water around not on - trees. Excess moisture on open wounds, leaves or needles can cause fungi to grow.
- Remove tree bags before winter and surround young trees with wire fencing to protect from deer, rabbits and rodents.
- Remember to avoid runoff onto paved surfaces.

### Watering restrictions in effect through Sept. 30

City watering restrictions are in effect through Sept. 30. Water before 11 a.m. or after 5 p.m. Even-numbered houses can water on even-numbered days, and odd-numbered houses can water on odd-numbered days.
