Southwest LRT open house, public hearing June 2

N APRIL 9, THE METROPOLITAN Council approved the project scope and budget for the Southwest LRT (Green Line Extension) and directed that design plans be submitted to the cities for review and action through a process called municipal consent. Minnetonka's municipal consent review will be limited to the part of the Southwest LRT corridor located within the city boundaries of Minnetonka.

Minnetonka residents are invited to attend an open house Monday, June 2, from 5–6 p.m. at the Minnetonka Community Center, 14600 Minnetonka Boulevard, regarding the project. Also on June 2, the Minnetonka City Council will hold its regular meeting at 6:30 p.m. in the Council Chambers at the Minnetonka Community Center, and as part of that meeting will host

a public hearing about the SWLRT project. The Minnetonka City Council will take final action on the municipal consent plans at its regular meeting Monday, June 23, at 6:30 p.m.

Absentee voting starts Friday, June 27

THIS YEAR'S STATE PRIMARY ELECTION is Tuesday, August 12, and absentee ballots will be available starting June 27.

Absentee Voting

Under a new state law, voters no longer have to state a specified reason in order to receive and cast an absentee ballot.

Voters should note the absentee ballot process requires additional steps different from the Election Day voting process. All absentee voters must complete both an application to receive a ballot and a certificate when casting the absentee ballot. Election judges compare the information on the two documents before accepting the ballot. Absentee voting may be done in person or by mail.

In Person

Beginning June 27, Minnetonka voters may vote absentee at Minnetonka City Hall, 14600 Minnetonka Blvd., or at the Hennepin County Government Center, 300 S. 6th St., Minneapolis, during regular business hours, 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Extended absentee voting hours will be available at both locations Saturday, August 9, 10 a.m. – 3 p.m. and Monday, August 11, 8 a.m. – 5 p.m.

By Mail

Absentee voting may also be done by mail. The voted ballot must be received at city hall by Election Day for the vote to count. Please allow sufficient time for postal service delivery.

The first step to vote absentee by mail is to complete an application. To receive an application call city hall at (952) 939-8200, visit *www.eminnetonka.com*, or fax a request to (952) 939-8244. Upon receipt of an application, a ballot with instructions will be mailed.

Solicitors and peddlers

Solicitors, peddlers and canvassers must follow these rules in Minnetonka:

- For-profit sale of products or services requires a license from the city. Only licensed peddlers and solicitors will have a photo ID issued by the city. The city doesn't endorse any specific product or service by issuing this license. For a current list of licensed solicitors, peddlers and canvassers, visit http://bit.ly/17NQAfS.
- Anyone putting flyers in a newspaper box does not need to register with the city.
- Charitable organizations conducting door-to-door sales or solicitations don't need a license from the city, unless they pay their solicitors. However, the city does ask charitable organizations to register.
- Every resident and business has the right to prohibit peddlers and solicitors from their property. If you post a sign on your home or business prohibiting solicitors, they are not permitted to approach your property.

About Sojourner Project

For more than 30 years, Sojourner Project has been working in the communities of western Hennepin County to increase the safety of victims of domestic violence through shelter, advocacy, safety planning and community education. In 2013, Sojourner served 262 victims of domestic

violence in Minnetonka.

Sojourner Shelter, a secure and confidential residence for battered women and their children, is located in Minnetonka and provides victims with a clean and safe environment, food, clothing, transportation. The shelter provides advocacy for safety planning, parenting issues, resource networking and legal concerns. The shelter also operates and staffs a 24-hour crisis line.

Sojourner believes that strong community partnerships are crucial to raise awareness of and to prevent domestic violence. To that end, Sojourner provides the following services:

- Partners with the Minnetonka Police
 Department. When a domestic violence
 arrest takes place in Minnetonka,
 police officers contact Sojourner. An
 advocate then contacts the victim to offer
 support, safety planning, information
 and referrals to needed services. The
 advocate continues to work with the
 victim throughout any criminal court
 proceedings. In a further partnership, a
 representative of the Minnetonka Police
 Department serves on the Sojourner
 board of directors.
- Educates area middle and high school students about dating and healthy relationships, and provides education for parents on how to discuss these topics.
- Trains law enforcement, prosecutors and attorneys, probation workers, social workers, teachers, medical clinic staff and first responders.

Sojourner's services are free of charge and available to anyone. Services are confidential and can be accessed 24 hours a day by any women in the west metro area, not just those in the Sojourner Shelter. 
