

Primary election is August 10

A RECENT CHANGE IN FEDERAL LAW, DESIGNED TO ENSURE THE VOTES of military and overseas voters are counted, requires that absentee ballots for military and overseas voters be available at least 45 days prior to an election.

In order to meet this time frame, a new state law moves the state this year, August 10. The date of the state general election remains the same — November 2.

Absentee voting

Absentee voting is available for those who are unable to visit the polling place on primary election day for one or more of the following reasons.

- Absence from the precinct
- Illness or disability
- Religious observance
- Service as an election judge in another precinct

Absentee ballots for the August 10 primary election will be available starting Friday, June 25.

In-person absentee voting

Minnetonka voters may vote absentee at Minnetonka City Hall or at the Hennepin County Government Center in Minneapolis during regular business hours, 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday.

Extended absentee voting hours will be available at both locations Saturday, August 7, from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m., and Monday, August 9, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Absentee voting by mail

Absentee voting may also be done by mail. Remember, the voted August 10—for the vote to count. Please allow sufficient time for postal service delivery.

The first step to vote absentee by mail is to complete an application. For an application, call city hall at (952) 939-8200, visit the city website at *www.eminnetonka.com*, or fax a request to (952) 939-8244. Once an application is received, the city will mail a ballot with instructions. ∞

Tour Burwell House

OOKING FOR A WAY TO GET IN TOUCH WITH MINNESOTA'S PAST THIS ummer? Then make plans to visit Minnetonka's own Charles H. Burwell House, listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

The Burwell House is open for tours Tuesdays, 12-3 p.m., Wednesdays, 6-8 p.m. and Saturdays, 12-4 p.m., through August 31. Tours are free and no reservations are required – just stop by the house at 13209 E. McGinty Road, Minnetonka. Parking is available on the grounds, the main floor of the house is handicap accessible, and the entire house is air-conditioned. ∞

Canoe scenic Minnehaha Creek

GAIN THIS YEAR, THE CITY OF MINNETONKA IS OFFERING A CANOE A rental and shuttle service for those interested in canoeing the beautiful Minnehaha Creek corridor through early summer.

The program runs through July 11, contingent on adequate creek water levels. Services are provided weekends during the entire season, and Friday evenings starting June 4. The cost to rent a canoe and shuttle is \$40 for a trip from Headwaters Park to County Road 73. This trip is about four miles in length and takes from one to two hours to complete.

Feel free to stop at any of the city parks along the way to explore or eat lunch, including at the historic Charles H. Burwell House, which is located between Baker and Plymouth roads and is open for tours Saturdays from noon to 4 p.m. Stop in and learn about Minnetonka's early history!

Tree disease control underway

THE CITY OF MINNETONKA'S SHADE TREE DISEASE CONTROL PROGRAM, **L** aimed at keeping Dutch elm disease (DED) and oak wilt (OW) at bay, has begun. Three city tree inspectors cover the entire city each summer, scouting for diseased elm and oak trees. Scouting continues until early September, when it becomes increasingly difficult to identify the diseases by their leaf symptoms.

If you see a tree you believe to have DED or OW, report it by calling (952) 988-8421. Be prepared to give the address and a detailed description of the tree's location. The person who reports a diseased tree can remain anonymous-and the caller's name is not considered public information. In order to use inspector time most efficiently, inspection requests will be fulfilled at the same time inspectors are scouting the neighborhood.

Two seasonal tree inspectors and the forester have been certified by the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources and will inspect public and private properties throughout the city for trees showing symptoms of DED or OW. They will look for elms and oaks with wiling, curled leaves and branch death. On private property, they will knock on the door to identify themselves before inspecting the tree. Both of these tree diseases are regulated by city ordinance

If an elm tree or oak tree is found to have either of these diseases, it is important to act promptly with removal or the suggested treatments in order to protect other elms and oaks on your property and throughout the city. If a tree has been identified as having Dutch elm disease or oak wilt, the city paints an orange ring around the tree and tags it with a special code.
