





Using water wisely this summer

THE TWIN CITIES METRO AREA HAS EXPERIENCED A DRIER-THAN-**L** normal spring. If dry conditions continue, the entire region is at risk of experiencing a severe drought. To reduce the strain on Minnetonka's water supply, please consider following these tips to help minimize outdoor water use during the summer months.

- A healthy lawn needs only one to two inches of water per week, the equivalent of watering about one hour per week - even less when it rains. Water early in the morning and use a rain guage to measure the amount of water you are putting on the grass.
- Cut grass to no shorter than two inches to reduce evaporation and promote deep root growth.
- Converting up to a fourth of your yard to drought-resistant turf, plants and shrubs can result in a 20 percent water savings.
- Collecting rain in rain barrels for outside use can result in significant water savings.
- Sweep with a broom, not a water hose.
- Use shut-off nozzles on hoses when washing cars.

Tree disease control program started

THE CITY OF MINNETONKA'S shade tree disease control program, designed to keep Dutch elm disease (DED) and oak wilt (OW) at bay, will start again June 1. Three city tree inspectors survey the entire city through early September, scouting for diseased elm and oak trees. If you see a tree you believe to have DED or OW on your property or while driving around in the city, you may report it starting June 1 by calling (952) 988-8421. Be prepared to give the address and a detailed description of the tree's location. The city's forestry staff will accept inspection requests and scout for diseased elm and oak trees through early September, when it becomes difficult to identify the diseases by their leaf symptoms.

The sawfly search

UNE IS THE TIME TO START J monitoring pine trees and shrubs for sawflies. Sawflies are destructive pecause, unlike deciduous trees, oines will not push out another flush of needles once they are eaten by sawflies. Favorite food sources include Mugo, Austrian, and red pines. If you noticed tiny crawling insects eating your pine needles last year, you may want to take action to eradicate them this year. Timing is everything in order to reach them at the weakest point of their life cycle. Two seasonal tree inspectors and the forester have been certified by the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources and will inspect public and private properties throughout the city for trees showing symptoms of DED or OW, including wilting, curled leaves and branch death. On private property, they will knock on the door to identify themselves before inspecting the tree. Both of these tree diseases are regulated by city ordinance.

If an elm tree or oak tree is found to have either of these diseases, it is important to act promptly with removal or the suggested treatments in order to protect other elms and oaks on your property and throughout the city.

If a tree has been identified as having DED or OW, the city paints an orange ring around the tree and staples a pink work order tag to it.

Mills Park hearing is June 22; design feedback invited July 13

THE MINNETONKA CITY COUNCIL WILL HOLD A PUBLIC HEARING Monday, June 22, at 6:30 p.m. in the council chambers to consider use of the Community Investment Fund to partially finance the development of Minnetonka Mills Park. Interest earnings from the trust fund would be used to construct a park and trails in the area just north of Minnetonka Boulevard between I-494 and Bridge Street. Residents are welcome to attend and provide input. If you are unable to attend the meeting, you may forward your comments to Assistant City Manager Geralyn Barone at gbarone@eminnetonka.com or (952) 939-8216.

In addition, residents are invited to provide feedback on the design for Minnetonka Mills Park at the Minnetonka City Council meeting set for Monday, July 13, at 6:30 p.m. in the council chambers. Proposed amenities for the park, part of the Minnehaha Creek Corridor improvements, include walking paths, pedestrian bridges over Minnehaha Creek, restoration of natural areas, landscaping and creek overlooks. Fall election filings open July 7

THE CITY OF MINNETONKA WILL HOLD MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS THIS fall. City positions that will be on the November 3 general election ballot include mayor and the two at-large council seats. Filings for these offices open Tuesday, July 7, and remain open through Tuesday, July 21. Interested persons may file for these offices during regular city hall hours, 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday. The filing fee is \$5.

To be eligible for office, candidates must be at least 21 years of age upon assuming office, and be a resident of Minnetonka for at least 30 days prior to the general election.

A primary will be held on Tuesday, September 15, 2009, if more than two people file for any of these offices.

All three school districts (Hopkins, Minnetonka, and Wayzata) will have school board positions on the fall ballot. We do not yet know if they will have referendum questions. People interested in filing for school district offices must contact the district offices.
