WHAT IS BEING PROPOSED?

We're proposing to construct an eight-foot-wide, multi-use asphalt trail for pedestrians and bicyclists and bury power and cable lines. Project goals are improved safety, mobility and connectivity along Hopkins Crossroad. Construction is proposed to occur in two phases:

- Phase 1 – 2024 – Cedar Lake Road to Hillside Lane
- Phase 2 – anticipated 2025 – Hillside Lane to Oak Knoll Terrace

WHAT WILL HAPPEN AT THE MEETING?

City staff will share details about the project, facilitate a brief discussion, answer questions and take input and feedback. Concept drawings of proposed improvements will be available for review.

POTENTIAL PROJECT IMPACTS

Projects of this nature can be disruptive. Potential project impacts may include: tree removal, driveway reconstruction, retaining wall construction and limited access to homes at select times. We will attempt to minimize these impacts as plans are finalized.

IF THIS PROJECT IS APPROVED, WILL I BE ASSESSED?

No. If the project is approved, it will be primarily be funded through the Trail System Expansion Fund. The city will also work with Hennepin County and other agencies to pursue additional funding opportunities.
