Save money on your utility bills

Schedule a visit with the Home Energy Squad to improve your home's energy efficiency and save money every month!

Your visit from the Home Energy Squad will include:

- Free installation of LED bulbs, a programmable thermostat, weather stripping, high-efficiency showerheads and faucet aerators
- Insulation inspection
- A blower door test and thermal imaging to identify cold spots or air leaks in your home
- A combustion safety test and carbon monoxide check
- A customized report with additional recommendations

The city will pay half of the \$100 fee for the first 280 homes to schedule an evaluation.

Ask the Fire Department

Question:

Why do so many firefighters show up to a fire?

Answer:

If you see a building on fire, the number of firefighters and vehicles that respond may seem overwhelming, but each serves an important role crucial to the task at hand and - most importantly - the safety of all involved.





While higher-ranking officers manage and supervise multiple work areas during a structure fire, other firefighters conduct search and rescue, operate fire pumps, pull ladders and hoses and perform salvage and overhaul work. Additional crews are there on standby to help in the most dangerous areas and rescue firefighters if needed.

In addition to our team, fire departments from surrounding cities are automatically dispatched to provide support and aid, and we happily return the favor to their communities when needed.



We hope your home or business never needs us to put out a fire. But if you do, our firefighters will be there as soon as we can - with adequate resources and support - to handle such a critical and complicated task in the safest, most efficient manner possible.

All homeowners and businesses must register alarm systems with the Minnetonka Police Department and pay a \$20 fee each year.




2020 official newspaper selected

2020 city tree sale begins online Feb. 3 at 8 a.m.

Each year, the city offers residents a chance to purchase young trees at a greatly reduced cost.

The mission of the tree sale is to create a healthier community forest consisting of trees of varying species and age. Our tree inventory provides aesthetically-pleasing options that will create wildlife and pollinator habitat, as well as climate change resilience.

In addition to trees, plastic tree guards and tree watering bags are also available for purchase.

The sale is held exclusively online at **minnetonkamn.gov** beginning Monday, Feb. 3 at 8 a.m.

Important dates and details

• Feb. 3 - Tree sale begins at 8 a.m.

Quantities are limited, and stock often sells out quickly - buy early for best selection. Visit **minnetonkamn.gov** to get a preview of the selection beginning Jan. 29. **All customers must create a new online account.**

May 15-16 - Tree sale pick-up event

Buyers will be mailed a reminder in late April. No trees are sold at this event.

Frequently asked questions

Can anyone buy trees in this sale?

 Only Minnetonka property owners may participate. If you have purchased two or more times previously, please consider waiting a few days to give others priority.

How many trees can I buy?

• You can buy up to two trees for each Minnetonka parcel you own. There is no limit to the number of tree guards or watering bags you may purchase.

Can I buy trees for other Minnetonka property owners?

• You may not order for other property owners through your account. Call the forestry office at 952-988-8407 to discuss options.

What if I own or manage multiple properties, or I represent an association?

• Call the forestry office at 952-988-8407 before the sale begins to discuss options.

How much do the trees cost?

• Prices will be available online at **minnetonkamn.gov** beginning Jan. 29.

Planting tips

- Not all trees are suitable for planting under power lines. Plan for the mature height of the tree(s) you choose.
- To prevent future sightline and utility conflicts, broadleaf trees must be planted at least 15 feet behind the curb and conifers must be planted more than 20 feet back.
