# Face masks required starting July 23

To slow the spread of COVID-19, the Minnetonka City Council approved an ordinance requiring face masks in indoor areas accessible to the public, effective Thursday, July 23 at 11:59 p.m.

In addition to requiring masks in indoor public spaces, the city also strongly encourages individuals to wear masks in indoor private spaces and outdoors when social distancing (at least six feet of separation) isn't possible.

## **Council to discuss ranked** choice voting Aug. 10

At its Aug. 10 meeting, the city council is expected to review the charter commission's report on ranked choice voting and decide whether to include the issue on the November 2020 election ballot. Residents are invited to attend the meeting to provide feedback.

The charter commission has been studying ranked choice voting - which is an electoral system in which voters are asked to rank candidates by preference on their ballots - for more than a year.

Minnetonka voters - not the city council - will ultimately decide if ranked choice voting will be adopted.

## Vote in the Aug. 11 primary election

The 2020 primary election is Tuesday, Aug. 11 and - with the lingering COVID-19 pandemic - it's our goal that every eligible Minnetonka voter can cast their ballot safely and securely.

During all in-person voting, election staff will follow CDC guidelines, wear personal protective equipment and disinfect surfaces regularly. We'll provide hand sanitizer and pens for each voter to use and keep.

### Vote early

- Absentee in-person at the Hennepin County Government Center through Aug. 10
- Absentee in-person at Minnetonka City Hall Aug. 4-10
  - We will offer a curbside option for voters who prefer not to enter city hall.
  - Extended hours on Saturday, Aug. 8 (10 a.m.-3 p.m.) and Monday, Aug. 10 (8 a.m.-5 p.m.)
- Absentee by mail learn how at minnetonkamn.gov/election

• Ballots must be received by Election Day to count.

### Planning begins for new regional trail


Three Rivers Park District is planning a new 16-mile regional trail that will run north-south and connect Minnetonka to Eden Prairie, Plymouth and Maple Grove. The "Eagle to Bryant Lake Regional Trail" will also connect Eagle Lake, Bryant Lake and French Regional Parks.

The proposed multi-use paved trail will connect to five existing regional trails, multiple city trails, Ridgedale Center and other retail centers in Minnetonka and Plymouth. It is also proposed to provide protected bike access along Baker Road.
