Minnetonka staff will be holding a neighborhood meeting to discuss the proposed park improvements on the Royzelle Lane cul-de-sac, scheduled for 2020. Please see map on the back side of this notice.

<u>Please note that this is the only notice that you will receive for this meeting</u>. You are receiving this notice because you reside within the area of properties who would be the likely park users; city code requires us to notify residents within a minimum of 400 feet of a project. We encourage you to take advantage of this opportunity to provide input on this project. Becoming actively involved in the neighborhood meeting process is the best way for you as a resident to provide your input. If you desire to be kept informed, and can't attend the meeting listed above, please contact the staff noted at the bottom of this letter.

What is being proposed?

In February of 2015, the city received a petition signed by 18 residents of your neighborhood requesting that a public park be constructed in the Robinwood neighborhood. The park board conducted meetings in January and March 2016 to review possible locations and receive neighborhood input. The proposed park will be in the category of a mini park, which is a small park with amenities sized for the neighborhood that it serves. The city council approved the proposed park in July 2016 and added the project to the 2017-2021 Capital Improvements Program, with construction planned for 2020.

What happens at the meeting?

The purpose of this public meeting is to obtain neighborhood input regarding the selection of amenities and play equipment in the park.

Will there be future meetings?

City staff will review information gathered at this meeting and prepare a new concept plan. A second neighborhood meeting will be held in January or February to review the proposed selections prior to moving forward with construction.

Will I be assessed?

There are no assessments being proposed for this project.






East of 11435 Royzelle Circle
