JUNETEENTH June 19, 2021

WHEREAS, The United States of America is a nation founded on the principles of liberty and justice for all, and the Civil War was fought to ensure that freedom would be shared by all; and

ITEM 10C – Resolution Requesting Funding from the 2022 State of Minnesota Capital Budget

After the agenda was released, further discussion occurred in regards to the School Trail Segment project. Due to the timing of the state bond awards, the portion of the project slated at and around Groveland elementary school has been removed from the 2022 State of Minnesota capital budget request.

Staff has since shifted their focus to the Hopkins Crossroad (County Road 73) trail project. This is a multi-year trail project planned for 2024 and 2025. The city was fortunate to receive a \$2.3 million grant from Met Council for a portion of this approximately \$5.6 million project. The city's remaining share of this project is still \$3.27 million, which is significant. Staff is recommending state bonding for 50 percent of the remaining share or \$1,635,000.

Resolution Authorizing the City to Submit an Application to the 2022 State of Minnesota Capital Budget

Be it resolved	by the City Council of the City of Minnetonka, Minnesota as follows:
Section 1.	Background.
1.01.	The City of Minnetonka supports the application to the 2022 State of Minnesota capital budget for both the Opus Public Space project and the Hopkins Crossroad (County Road 73) trail project, with the city's first priority given to the Opus Public Space project.
1.02.	The Opus Public Space project is intended to transform a business park into a place where office, diverse housing choices and transit coexist.
1.03.	The public space is intended to support existing and new residents, but also benefit the 14,000 existing workers in the area.
1.04.	The Hopkins Crossroad (County 73) trail project will provide trail connections to three public schools in the Hopkins School District providing safe access for children while connecting pedestrian access to the larger regional trail system.
1.05.	Both of these projects meet the criteria required to be included in the State of Minnesota's capital budget.
Section 2.	Council Action.
2.01.	The City Council of the City of Minnetonka is compliant with the 2022 Minnesota Capital Budget requirement in conjunction with M.S. 16A86, subd. (6), passing a resolution of support for the application of funding from general obligation bond proceeds.
