Follow these fireworks safety tips

Celebrate safely (and legally) this July with these safety tips from the Minnetonka Fire Department.

- Fireworks that fly or explode are illegal in Minnesota - don't buy or use them!
- Legal fireworks in Minnesota include sparklers, cones and tubes that emit sparks and novelty items like snakes and party poppers.



- Always supervise children during firework use and set a good example for safe behavior.
- Only use fireworks on private property; they're illegal on public property (including parks and beaches).
- Alcohol and fireworks don't mix.
- Use a metal bucket with water to extinguish all fireworks - including sparklers - before throwing out what's left.
- Wear shoes at all times while fireworks are present.
- Homemade fireworks and explosives are not only illegal - they're extremely dangerous. Ensure your children are using safe, professionally made fireworks.
- If something goes wrong, even something small, don't hesitate call 911 immediately!

Ranked-choice voting education continues

Summer is here, and Minnetonka's ranked choice voting (RCV) education and outreach efforts are officially underway, and will prepare voters to use RCV in the city's November election.

Summer is also the time for candidates to file for one of three city council seats on the November ballot.

The city is committed to providing the following resources to better serve voters and candidates.

MINNETONKA PROTECTS POLLINATORS

Most of the flowering plants on Earth need the help of animal pollinators to reproduce. Unfortunately, pollinator species - from bees, butterflies and moths to flies, beetles and hummingbirds - are declining globally due to pressure from habitat loss, chemical use and climate change. And they need our help.



In 2017, the City of Minnetonka answered the call by signing the Mayors' Monarch Pledge. This National Wildlife Federation program provides a framework to guide cities in pollinator protection efforts.

In 2021, the National Wildlife Federation declared the City of Minnetonka a Monarch Champion. Only a handful of the program's 900 participating cities have reached that goal, which requires extensive public outreach, ongoing restoration work and updated city ordinances that increase habitat on private property.

July in Minnetonka is Monarch and Pollinator Awareness Month. Watch our social media accounts and website to learn how you can celebrate pollinators, learn about their importance, and take action to help them thrive.

Plant for pollinators!

Diverse native plants support many different pollinators, which in turn feed birds and other wildlife. Stay tuned for info on the city's online plant sale.
