### **Absentee voting begins Sept. 17**

Starting in September, Minnetonka voters can cast their ballots for the upcoming 2021 Election. Three city council seats are up for election this year - mayor and two at-large seats.



#### How to vote absentee

- In-person: Stop by Minnetonka City Hall, 14600 Minnetonka Blvd., during regular business hours, Sept. 17-Nov. 1.
  - Watch for extended hours leading up to Election Day.
- By mail: Hennepin County oversees all absentee voting by mail.
   Residents can request a ballot at hennepin.us/residents/elections/absentee-voting.

### **Election Day is Tuesday, Nov. 2**

Polls will be open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. Two polling locations have changed from 2020:

- Ward 1: Precinct E voters will vote at Minnetonka Public Works, 11522 Minnetonka Blvd.
- Ward 3: Precinct B voters will vote in the Minnetonka Council Chambers, 14600 Minnetonka Blvd.

### Ranked choice voting

Minnetonka voters will use ranked choice voting (RCV) to identify their candidates of choice. A sample ballot and information about the RCV process will be mailed to all Minnetonka residences in early September.

### **Drop off unwanted items Sept. 11**

Get rid of unwanted appliances, tires or other household items at our Special Community Drop-off Day!

Saturday, Sept. 11 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. Minnetonka Public Works 11522 Minnetonka Blvd.

Accepted items: appliances, furniture, lumber, scrap metal, tires, toilets, non-metal sinks and windows, automotive/12V batteries, used clothing and household items and much more. View our website for a complete list.



**Not accepted:** electronics, garbage, hazardous waste, liquids, copiers, fax machines, household batteries

 Household batteries (AA, D, 9V, etc.) are no longer accepted. Hennepin County's drop-off facilities accept batteries.

**Payment:** There is a charge for most items. Cash and checks payable to "City of Minnetonka" are accepted.

**COVID-19 precaution:** Please stay in your vehicle. Our staff will check you in and unload to limit contact.

# Fall leaf drop-off site opens Sept. 18

Each fall, the city accepts leaves, yard waste and brush from Minnetonka residents at the Public Works Facility at 11522 Minnetonka Blvd. Residents must present a driver's license, state ID or Minnetonka utility bill. Commercial tree and lawn services must prove materials came from a Minnetonka address.

Keep leaves and yard waste separate from brush and drop off in their respective areas. Bags cannot be left at the drop-off site, including compostable bags.

### **LEAF DROP-OFF SITE**

The leaf drop-off site is open between Sept. 18 and Nov. 20. Friday and Sunday hours aren't offered until November.

# Drive safely when you see a school bus

School is back in session. And that means more school buses on the roads. Follow these rules to keep our children safe.



Always maintain a safe following distance. Keep as much space as possible between your vehicle and the bus in front of you. If you're in front of a school bus, it's important you're paying attention to traffic and situations on the road that might cause you to slam on your brakes.

In traffic, avoid "cutting" in front of a bus. Many bus drivers leave a safe following distance between the bus and the car ahead of them to ensure a safer environment for passengers. Even if your car can fit into the space, drivers should always avoid cutting in front of a bus or transit vehicle.


Watch for buses that are loading or unloading children. Be prepared to stop when the bus stops. The most dangerous area around a school bus is the space 10 feet around the vehicle since this radius falls into the driver's blind spot. Be sure to stop more than 10 feet behind a school bus to allow passengers a safe space for entering and exiting.

**NEVER pass a stopped school bus!** No matter what state you live in, it's illegal to pass a school bus that has stopped to load or unload children. This rule includes passing a bus from either direction.

Remember: Slow Down. Stay Alert!

# Review your fire safety plan this fall

The start of a new school year is the perfect time to review your family's fire safety plan. In an average fire, you have only three minutes to safely escape, so it's important for everyone in the house to know the plan.





- Have working smoke alarms on every level and in every bedroom.
- Make sure your family has a fire escape plan in place and practice it.
- Know two exits from every room.
- Ensure windows can open and screens can be easily removed.
- Establish a safe family meeting place outside the home.
- Encourage children to know how and when to call 911.
- Have a fire extinguisher and ensure everyone knows how to use it.



Pet waste left behind doesn't disappear. Instead, runoff (rain, snow melt, etc.) carries it to storm sewers and into our lakes, streams and wetlands. Bacteria and parasites in pet



waste pose a health threat to people, pets and wildlife, and the waste feeds algae and aquatic plants to reduce water quality and appearance.


