

**Minutes  
Minnetonka City Council Emergency Meeting  
Monday, June 1, 2020**

**1. Call to Order**

Mayor Brad Wiersum called the meeting to order at 4:00 p.m.

**2. Roll Call**

Council Members Rebecca Schack, Susan Carter, Deb Calvert, Bradley Schaeppi, Kissy Coakley, Brian Kirk, and Mayor Brad Wiersum were present.

**3. Items relating to emergency declaration and curfew:**

**A) Resolution consenting to mayor's declaration of local emergency; extending the period of the local emergency and authorizing certain actions**

**B) An Emergency Ordinance establishing a temporary nighttime curfew**

City Manager Barone introduced the item, noting that a curfew was previously authorized for and implemented on Saturday, May 30 and Sunday, May 31 in response to the events following the death of George Floyd. The proposed extension of the curfew would align with that of neighboring cities.

Police Chief Scott Boerboom offered comments regarding the death of George Floyd and the techniques used by the Minneapolis officers responsible in that incident. Boerboom then reported on the weekend curfew, indicating no incidents occurred.

Councilmembers presented their questions and comments regarding extension of the citywide curfew. Boerboom responded to these questions and comments.

City Attorney Corrine Heine summarized the actions that have been taken already by the council, along with the actions proposed.

Barone highlighted the strategy for city communications and how residents will be notified of the extension of the local emergency and associated curfew. Communications Manager Kari Knoll elaborated on this strategy.

Councilmembers presented their questions and comments regarding on these related communication efforts.

Kirk noted that "Section 5. Duration" of the ordinance is incorrectly numbered and should be changed to "Section 6. Duration".

Schack moved, Kirk seconded a motion to adopt Res. 2020-042 and Emergency Ord. 2020-09 as amended.

All voted "yes". Motion carried.

**4. Adjournment**

Calvert moved, Kirk seconded a motion to adjourn the meeting at 4:55 p.m.

All voted "yes". Motion carried.
